Pre-camp activities: NSS Programme Officer Mrs.Pranita Kamath along with the ,4 NSS student leaders conducted survey of campsite on 15st December 2016. All the arrangements were conducted for the camp at NityanandSmruti ,Ganeshpuri.

Day Ist -28th December 2016

The NSS student volunteers and Programme Officers assembled in the college campus early in the morning. A bus was arranged for travelling to camp site. The team reached the camp site at around 12 am. The student volunteers carried their lunch .After reaching the camp site in the afternoon, lunch was shared with all vonuteers. Rooms were allocated for the students. There were separate halls for the girls and boys.

After lunch, all volunteers assembled in the conference room. Five groups were formed .In each group 7 students were allotted. Student members of each group selected their leader. College has started with the extension work activity from year 2009-10 for B.Sc.I.T. and B.M.S. Department.


