ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CELL 2015-16

Some say that good entrepreneurs are born and not made. Others disagree, saying good entrepreneurship is a talent that can be learned and nurtured. The truth probably lies somewhere in the middle. But all would have been worthless without Sanjay's own unique brand of commitment, high energy and determination.

Tenacity, perseverance and courage are the other characteristics of the world's most successful entrepreneurs. They need a high level of tolerance for risk. They have to believe in themselves, sometimes against great odds. They have to be prepared to pick up pieces and start over again if they don't succeed at first.

With our Prime Minister Narendra Modi's view on Make in India, India will be leading country where entrepreneurs large and small are concerned. The economic value created by these individuals will turn out to be phenomenal.

In order to develop young entrepreneurs in our College, an entrepreneurs' cell was formed and inaugurated on 17th December, 2015. The inauguration also saw Dr. Minu Mehta, Professor at IES who has a passion for entrepreneurship explained the concept of entrepreneurship to students in lucid language. Took 'Thirsty Crow' as a story and explained in simple words 'idea generation'.

Another entrepreneur, Ms. Nishita Mantri, founder of 'Bambooshoot Communication' shared her experience and difficulties she faced in starting business of her own.

AIFMB assigned Ms. Rakhi Pathak as coordinator. Her speech was inspiring and motivating.

Ms. Sujata Nandi Roy in her inaugural speech delivered the importance of entrepreneurship in today's world.

Our Principal, Dr. Debajit N. Sarkar through his inspirational speech, gave an opportunity to start co-operative for stationery. Further, encouraged learners to conduct activities pertaining to entrepreneur.

Overall, 54 students from B.M.S registered for entrepreneurs' cell. Students were inspired, excited and motivated to carry out various activities. Students' started selling fruit plate. Through this they learnt to maintain income & expenditure account, pricing of the product, profit making, reducing the costs so that they could earn profits etc.
